<u>Harvest Day 2015</u>

Let us gather together as a family for a special morning of worship on Tuesday, November 10. We welcome this year's special guest speaker Rev. Amy Lenow, who currently serves as an Associate Staff member at VIPCARE (The Virginia Institute of Pastoral Care). Our scriptural theme is taken from John 13:34 "A new commandment I give to you that you love one another; just as I have loved you, you are also to love one another."

Registration is in the Welcome Center at 9:30 am; Meditation & Worship in the Sanctuary at 9:45 am; and our special Southern Brunch, prepared by Kelly Kindle, in Trinity Hall at 11:00 am. Reservation forms (\$10, payable to TUMW) are available in the Welcome Center. The first 50 registered attendees to arrive will receive a free TUMW cookbook. Thereafter the cookbooks cost \$10 each, with \$6 to benefit Trinity Youth & \$4 for special mission work of UMW or Trinity.

The 2015 Offering Recipients

Since 1999 **The All God's Children Camp** has offered children ages 7 to 12, with an incarcerated parent, a week of sanctuary at camp surrounded by caring adults, programs and FUN! Alarming statistics reveal that these are the children most at risk of repeating the generational cycle of poverty and incarceration. In the past 14 years AGCC has served over 1755 campers. The Mattaponi Healing Eagle Clinic (MHEC) is a free health clinic open to all Native Americans in Virginia at the Mattaponi Reservation in King William County. Native Americans receive substandard health care and suffer from severe nutritional issues. Many of the clinic's patients are seeing the doctor for the first time in their lives. With the exception of the Pamunkey Tribe, none of the eight recognized Virginia Tribes receives care through the Indian Health Care Service. Since 2009 Trinity members have held summer van trips carrying over-the-counter medical supplies and funds to assist with the at-cost prescription medicines made available to the MHEC through the West Point Pharmacy. The Mattaponi Healing Eagle Clinic is a Virginia Conference Benevolence and Advance Special.

We are celebrating our <u>63rd Harvest Day</u>. It all started in November 1953 when the WSCS Executive Committee, with unanimous consent from members during a June Meeting, decided to forego bazaars and hold a Harvest Day worship service instead, as a way to raise funds to pay their annual pledge of \$500 to Trinity's Building Fund. In fact from 1953 to 1962,100% of the Harvest Day offerings were donated to Trinity. However, from 1968 to the present, the focus has shifted to mission needs of over 70 ministries like Henry Fork Service Center, UMFS, Central UMC's Kids Club, Sherbourne UMC's Food Pantry, and Guardian Place.
