Pastor's Corner

Caution. Reduce speed. Decelerate. Slow Down. These are not messages we want to hear as we spend all too much time on our various interstate highways. Such messages invariably mean traffic is ahead, or that we are approaching road construction, or even the dreadful possibility of an accident. On the roadways "Reduce Speed" is bad news. In life, however, and in Advent in particular, things are rather the opposite.

Advent is our holy season of preparation. We are invited to prepare the way of the Lord. We are invited to prepare ourselves, our hearts and our lives for the Divine Mystery of the Incarnation, that is to say God's coming to us at Christmas. "Reduce Speed" is an important part of that message. Now this may all sound counterintuitive. The "Holidays" encourage us to speed up. There is so much to do. The cultural, secular trappings of the season are quite demanding: shopping, decorating, cooking, entertaining, traveling! Whew! You would not be the first person to secretly wish to just get through it and have it all behind us. To which I say, "Caution. Reduce speed. Decelerate. Slow Down."

Allow Advent to speak to you. Grab one of our Advent Devotion books. Carve out a few minutes each day. Find at least one way to share with or serve others. Be quiet. We can all fall victim to the "holiday crush" or we can learn from the wisdom of the ages. The glory of Christmas is too great for one day (or even the more appropriate twelve days). We need Advent – desperately. Slow down. Listen. The miracle will come.

We gather on **Mondays at 11:30 AM** in the **Chapel** to pray for Trinity, our neighborhood, our country and the world. All are welcome to join us!



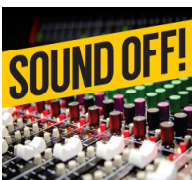
Mature Men’s Fellowship

Property Update

Church Council, Trustees, Finance, and the Trinity Foundation have worked carefully during the last four years to maintain our building and grounds. This is a continuous process, and we have received great support from the congregation with financial gifts for specific items. As we move into 2016, listed below are the identified items that need attention. Costs are rough estimates:

- Develop a plan for the renovation of Eaton Hall including kitchen, bathroom, and storage
- Develop a plan for the renovation of all rooms currently used for nurseries
- Replace convection ovens Trinity Hall Kitchen: \$6,000
- Improve interior/exterior directional signage: \$1,500
- Develop a plan for improving the lighting in the Sanctuary, Chapel, Parlor, and Trinity Hall
- Replace HVAC unit Trinity Hall roof: \$20,000
- Exterior painting: \$10,000
- Continue installation of TV monitors in classrooms: \$1,500 per classroom

Calendar Year-end Contributions

IRS Code 10170A-1(b) states that only funds received by December 31, 2015 or post-marked by December 31, 2015 may be counted as 2015 contributions. The date of receipt or the postmark is the key to determining the year of receipt. Thus, if someone hand carries a check to the church on January 2, 2016 that is dated December 31, 2015 it is a **2016** gift according to IRS regulations. But, if a check arrives by mail at the church on January 2, 2016 and it is postmarked December 31, 2015 and the check is dated December 31, 2015 or before, it is a **2015** gift.
