*"The heavens are telling the glory of God;
and the firmament proclaims his handiwork."*

Psalm 19:1

Psalm 19 is one of my very favorite psalms. I often think of it on these cool autumn mornings. Walking out to the curb to get the morning paper I look up, see the constellations, and I am reminded of the glory of God. Which brings me to the Dillard Forum...

"The Dillard Forum is a ministry of Trinity United Methodist Church designed to examine how faith communities speak to the 21st century," so says our brochure. Allow me to elaborate: The Dillard Forum encourages us to grow in faith (as in Connect to God, Grow in faith, Serve the world.) Named in honor and memory of Dr. F. Douglas Dillard, Jr. the Forum pushes us to critical thinking and reflection. I am very excited about this year's Dillard Forum.

Dr. R. Kendall Soulen will be lecturing on *Glorious God, Magnificent Universe; Contemporary Issues in Science and Christian Faith*. Dr. Soulen is Professor of Systematic Theology at Wesley Theological Seminary. (As a loyal Dukie I am traditionally rather miserly in my praise of that particular institution. But I will say that Soulen is truly one of their shining stars!) You will find that his considerable scholarship is complemented by his insight and depth of thought. As a lecturer he is engaging and approachable. And, of course, his subject is timely and very important.

Kendall is also a friend. It is a joy and a privilege to be welcoming him here at Trinity. The Dillard Forum is a "must attend" event. This year will be great (okay, every year it is great, but this year it will be especially so.) Join me for this year's Dillard Forum, November 8-9. The Dillard Forum to present Dr. R. Kendall Soulen

Ever wonder how science and religion can be reconciled? How evolution and creation fit together? Come hear Dr. R. Kendall Soulen speak at the 2015 Dillard Forum November 8-9. His lectures will focus on the topic "Glorious God, Magnificent Universe: Contemporary Issues in Science and Christian Faith." Dr. Soulen is professor of Systematic Theology at Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, D.C. and has devoted much of his scholarship to Christian theology and contemporary culture. Dr. Soulen is an elder in the Virginia Conference of the United Methodist Church and in June was elected delegate to the 2016 General Conference.

Dr. Soulen will present a different lecture and discussion at each session of the Dillard Forum, all related to the overall theme, "Glorious God, Magnificent Universe." On Sunday morning, November 8, his first lecture will take place in the sanctuary at 9:30 AM with "Soulmates: Why Science and Christian Faith Fight but Won't Get Divorced." He will follow that on Sunday evening at 7:00 PM with "In the Beginning: God and the Fine-Tuned Universe." Monday's noontime lecture over lunch in Trinity Hall is "In the Image of God: Human Uniqueness and Evolution." The closing lecture and discussion in the sanctuary Monday night at 7:00 PM is "Goodwill to All: Christian Faith and Life on Other Worlds."

Sherbourne United Methodist Church is itself a very small congregation and relies not only on its own members, but on other churches to donate food. During June, July, and August, Sherbourne received 5,453 pounds of food from congregations including Trinity. In addition to providing fresh vegetables in August, Shalom Farms donated 200 pounds of sweet potatoes that we were able to deliver to Sherbourne in late September. Those potatoes were gone in 2 hours!

During this time of the year, Sherbourne would like to provide each family they serve with a canned ham and "holiday fixings," including such items as green beans, corn, peas, instant potatoes, stuffing, gravy, brownie, cake and cookie mixes, cake icing, and pudding. While we place emphasis on donating food on the first Sunday of the month, donations are always welcome. You can bring nonperishable items to the Mission Central anytime.

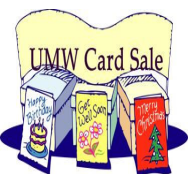
